
Housing survey

 - Not for public release



Some survey results: Facility







Number of trips onsite per year






70-80% of respondents don't use apartments, guest house, or efficiencies These people primarily use the dorms (evenly throughout the year)

Making reservations

The system generally works, but a non-trivial fraction (30%) report having trouble at one time or another



~15% have been turned down for a room, 10% have had to change plans



Price/performance


Is cost of dorms appropriate?



BNL vs. other labs




We are seen as being substantially worse than other labs, although hard to factor in price

How much would you pay?




Could clearly charge more for dorms

Higher quality housing?


>50% would pay for higher quality hotel rooms (need to break out by facility)



>50% would pay for higher quality new housing (need to break out by facility)



Effect on ability to work at BNL?



Only ~20% would be unaffected by BNL eliminating on-site housing
